

Southern California Edison Company's Declaration of Confidential Designation
Pursuant to the California Public Utilities Commission's Rules of Practice and
Procedure

I, Raymond Fugere, declare and state:

1. I am the Director of Asset & System Intelligence at Southern California Edison Company (SCE). As such, I had responsibility for overseeing and reviewing SCE's confidential materials being submitted to the California Public Utilities Commission in connection with certain data request responses. Shinjini Menon, Senior Vice President of System Planning and Engineering, delegated authority to me to sign this declaration, and I am authorized to request confidential treatment of the materials described below on behalf of SCE.
2. I am making this declaration in accordance with General Order 66-D and related California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) precedent that governs the submission of confidential documents to the Commission.
3. I have personal knowledge of the facts and representations herein and, if called upon to testify, could and would do so, except for those facts expressly stated to be based upon information and belief, and as to those matters, I believe them to be true.

It is in the public interest that the information not be disseminated publicly. Release of detailed asset and risk event information could make SCE's facilities vulnerable to attack and could be valuable information in planning an attack on critical infrastructure. Further, providing this information in addition to and in relation with Critical Facility information could further the consequences of such an attack. There is little to no benefit to making this information publicly available. Thus, the public interest in maintaining the confidentiality of this information far outweighs the public interest in disclosing it.</p>
