STATION UNITS NOS. 2 & 3 ON-GOING SEISMIC PROGRAM, AND
NEW SEISMIC RESEARCH PROJECTS AND ANALYSES

The California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) has scheduled Evidentiary Hearings in the above application proceeding. Modifications to this schedule may be made by the assigned Administrative Law Judge (ALJ) for this proceeding. The Evidentiary Hearings are scheduled for:

November 8 – 9, 2011 Starting at 10:00 a.m. on November 8, 2011 CPUC Hearing Room 500 Van Ness Avenue San Francisco, CA 94102

On April 15, 2011, Southern California Edison Company (SCE) filed an application with the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) seeking authority to recover the costs associated with the San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station Units 2 and 3 (SONGS 2 & 3) on-going seismic program and new seismic research projects and analyses. SCE's request was initially made in SCE's 2012 General Rate Case Application No. 10-11-015. However, pursuant to the CPUC's March 1, 2011 ruling in Application No. 10-11-015, SCE is making its request through a separate application.

SONGS is jointly owned by SCE, San Diego Gas & Electric Company, and the City of Riverside. SCE estimates that the total cost to the owners to perform the work requested in this application is \$64.0 million. This application requests authorization for SCE to recover its share (\$50.1 million) of the associated revenue requirements in rates. The total estimated cost of \$50.1 million will be recovered over a five year period. Therefore SCE will increase its revenue requirements by approximately \$10.0 million in 2012 and this amount will remain in rates through the end of 2016.

Compared to revenue at present rates as of March 1, 2011, this application could result in a revenue increase of approximately \$10.0 million, or 0.09% beginning in 2012 and continuing through the end of 2016. If total rates were to change as requested, an average residential customer using 600 kilowatt-hours (kWh) per month would see an increase of \$0.16 per month, from \$103.50 to \$103.66. The actual impact on your bill may vary depending on your energy usage and other Commission orders.

EVIDENTIARY HEARINGS

At the Evidentiary Hearings, only formal parties of record provide testimony and are subject to cross-examination before the CPUC's ALJ. These hearings are open to the public, but only those who are formal parties of record can participate. The CPUC has their own court reporters who will record the comments of those formal parties of record participating in the Evidentiary Hearings. After considering all proposals and evidence presented during the formal hearing process, the assigned ALJ will make recommendations to the assigned Commissioner in this proceeding. The final decision is made by a majority vote of the five CPUC Commissioners at a scheduled Commission Meeting. The Commissioners may approve SCE's proposed request, the ALJ's proposed decision, an alternate decision filed by one of the Commissioners, or the Commissioners may reject the proposed application filing by SCE. CPUC PROCESS

The DRA's mission is to represent the interests of all utility customers throughout the state to obtain the lowest possible rates for service consistent with reliable and safe service levels. DRA has a multi-disciplinary staff with expertise in economics, finance, accounting, and engineering.
