No.	Question	Response
1	How does being a Disable Veteran Owned business impact the selection process?	SCE encourages Diverse Business Enterprises (DBEs) to participate in the solicitations, however it does not directly impact the selection process (e.g. There is not an adder applied to DBEs). 2	What needs to be in an Environmental Review Letter?	Please refer to 'Section 6.02 - Offer Instructions' of the Spring 2021 DAC-GT 3 & CSGT 3 Participant Instructions for details on what is needed as part of the Environmental Review Letter.
3	Is evidence of a complete interconnection application submitted to SCE sufficient for the interconnection evidence?	Please refer to 'Section 2.01(d) - DAC-GT Project Eligibility Requirements' and 'Section 3.01(d) - CSGT Project Eligibility Requirements' of the Spring 2021 DAC-GT 3 & CSGT 3 Participant Instructions for details on SCE's interconnection requirements.
4	Who is responsible for enrolling customers to the DAC-GT and CSGT programs?	SCE is responsible for enrolling customers into both the DAC-GT and CSGT programs. However, with respect to the CSGT program, the project sponsor(s) are encouraged to help conduct outreach and recruit subscribers to their sponsored project, they are not contractually obligated to enroll the customers.
5	Will SCE pay for unsubscribed energy?	Yes, pursuant the DAC Power Purchase Agreement (PPA), SCE purchases all energy (i.e., even if a project is not fully subscribed).
6	Under Contract Length, why does one Offer require a 10-year delivery term (as opposed to 20)?	SCE prefers a 10-year offer and uses this as a basis of comparison against all offer terms. SCE encourages competitive offers of various term lengths.
7	Can a project with a Generator Interconnection Agreement (GIA) larger than the project capacity limits submit an offer?	Yes, a project with a GIA larger than the project capacity limits may submit an offer into the programs, provided that the project meets the

		eligibility requirements of the project size (0.5 - 20 MW for DAC and 4.39 MW or less for CSGT).
8	Do both Disadvantaged Community Green Tariff (DAC-GT) and Community Solar Green Tariff (CSGT) programs provide a bill discount to participating customers?	Both the DAC-GT and CSGT programs provide a 20% bill discount from a participant's otherwise applicable rate.
9	For the CSGT program, what is needed for the Sponsor Letter of Commitment?	Please refer to 'Section 3.01(q) – CSGT Project Eligibility Requirements' of the Spring 2021 DAC-GT 3 & CSGT 3 Participant Instructions for details on what is needed as part of the Sponsor Letter of Commitment
10	Are there any CSGT specific prioritizations as a part of the RFO	Please refer to 'Section 5.06 – Preferences' of the Spring 2021 DAC-GT 3 & CSGT 3 Participant Instructions for any CSGT specific prioritizations

12	Can we leverage existing facilities?	No. Eligible projects must be new facilities.
13	Can you please confirm if energy storage systems paired with solar PV systems are eligible for these RFOs?	Energy Storage paired systems with solar PV systems are not eligible for this RFO. Please refer to the RFO Instructions for eligibility criteria.
